On the Sunday afternoon of March 17, a group of ten enthusiastic artists gathered at the studio, to participate in a watercolour workshop led by Clive Sinclair. Clive is an accomplished artist, known to many of us, either through his involvement with the Twenty Melbourne group of which he's been a member for many years, or through his long presence at BAS as a tutor, a position he also held for many years, building a dedicated following of members in the process.

Clive had asked the ten participants to bring along two full sheets (76 x 36 cm) of watercolour paper. The schedule was to complete two paintings in the six hour session, allowing for the hour's break for lunch.

Clive began by doing a demo of a still life, painted figuratively and with a limited palette of colours. He used large brushes and worked with broad brush movements both from the wrist and the shoulder. He also explained some basic fundamentals about watercolour painting, including the number of washes that could be used, colour combinations he favoured and how to plan and leave selected parts of the paper blank or white.






When we began our own work, many of us were quite nervous about doing a full sheet as few of us had previously done so. Clive moved around the artists, giving pointers, answering questions and suggesting we move a distance back to view and critique our own work. He was very encouraging and offered his suggestions to improve our paintings.

After the break, he did a second demo, this one of a seascape with a large passage of sky. This demo was quite abstracted in contrast to the first. He used a wider variety of colours, left certain areas white and promoted a "loose" and more spontaneous approach. He encouraged us not to copy his demo, but to follow our own path, using his

work as a basic outline that could be varied to reflect each person's individual style.

This was a very enjoyable session with a knowledgeable and accomplished teacher, that took quite a few of us into some new and exciting directions.


